

WHO WE ARE

St. Hilda's, situated on the unceded traditional territory of the shishalh First Nation, is a member of the Anglican Church of Canada and the worldwide Anglican Communion. As a community, we welcome and celebrate human diversity - including spirituality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, and abilities. We aim to create a space where people of any faith or none can question and discover the sacred in life through openness, struggle, laughter and prayer, lived out through a common commitment to be in solidarity with the poor and marginalized, and to cherish Creation.

CHILDREN

Children play a central part when we gather to worship. We welcome them as they gather for a Children's Time at the beginning of the service. We send them off with a song for Sunday School, and they return in time for Communion—the Lord's supper. A Nursery Room is available for parents with babies and toddlers at the back of the Church.

HOLY COMMUNION

ALL are welcome to come forward and receive communion, the divine life of Jesus which comes to us in gifts of bread and wine. Come as you are. Instructions for people joining this meal for the first time are printed in the bulletin.

for the coming of God's reign of justice and love


All: Jesus Christ is good news for the poor, release for the captives, recovery for the afflicted, and liberty for those who are oppressed

The Invitation

Receiving Communion

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread.

If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.

<u>Truth and Reconciliation</u>: St. Hilda's is inviting the community to ring bells together at 12:00 noon today. Bells can have multiple meanings, ringing out celebration, grief, or warning, but they always call us to pay attention. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission asks churches across the country to ring their bells at 12:00 noon on May 31 as a call to pay attention to:

- honour residential school survivors,
- recognize the formal close of the TRC, and
- commit to working towards a reconciled future for all of Canada.

<u>Live release of TRC Report Tuesday June 2</u>: The Truth and Reconciliation Commission, which is meeting for the last time in Ottawa between May 31 and June 3, will release its final findings based on its hearings over the last 5 years of its mandate on the morning of Tuesday June 2.

St. Hilda's is opening its door at 6:00 am (9 am EDT) Tuesday morning and inviting anyone who is interested in watching the live release of the TRC report to come watch it together on the big-screen TV in the Gathering Room.

The Anglican Church of Canada will mark the closing ceremonies of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) and its work to address the tragic legacy of Indian residential schools with a project reflecting one of the event's key themes—that this ending is just the beginning.

The church is calling for 22 days of prayer and renewal in its commitment to healing and reconciliation for all the peoples of Canada—Indigenous and non-Indigenous—that will begin Sunday, May 31, at the start of the TRC closing event in Ottawa, leading up to the National Aboriginal Day of Prayer on Sunday, June 21.

The #22Days project includes four major elements:

- A specially created 22 Days website (www.22days.ca) with resources on the history of residential schools, the relationship of Indigenous peoples to the Anglican Church of Canada, the work of the TRC, and worship material for the National Aboriginal Day of Prayer;
- Sacred stories on the 22 Days website telling the experiences of residential school survivors—stories of trauma, shame, and abuse, but also courage, resilience, and hope—accompanied by a daily prayer;
- A wall on the 22 Days website where users can post their own stories of learning and describe their commitment to improved relations with Canada's First Peoples; and
- The ringing of church bells across Canada for each of the 1,181 indigenous women and girls who were reported murdered or missing between 1980 and 2012. Bells may be rung on National Aboriginal Day or throughout the 22 days. On three successive Wednesdays (June 3, 10, and 17), some Anglican churches across Canada will ring their bells 1,181 times at 2 p.m. local time, starting in Newfoundland and ending in British Columbia, ringing for an estimated five and a half hours.

At the heart of the #22Days project—endorsed by Archbishop Fred Hiltz, Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, along with National Indigenous Anglican Bishop Mark MacDonald and the Anglican House of Bishops—is a commitment to listen to the stories of residential school survivors and work for positive change.
