

There are many ways and there is no one particular way to be a part of this vibrant community. Join us today with an open mind, and be prepared to discover a home for your spirit that is inclusive, incarnational, and joyful.

WHO WE ARE

St. Hilda's, situated on the unceded traditional territory of the shishalh First Nation, is a member of the Anglican Church of Canada and the worldwide Anglican Communion. As a community, we welcome and celebrate human diversity - including spirituality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, and abilities. We aim to create a space where people of any faith or none can question and discover the sacred in life through openness, struggle, laughter and prayer, lived out through a common commitment to be in solidarity with the poor and marginalized, and to cherish Creation.

CHILDREN

Children play a central part when we gather to worship. We welcome them as they gather for a Children's Time at the beginning of the service. We send them off with a song for Sunday School, and they return in time for Communion—the Lord's supper. A Nursery Room is available for parents with babies and toddlers at the back of the Church.

HOLY COMMUNION

ALL are welcome to come forward and receive communion, the divine life of Jesus which comes to us in gifts of bread and wine. Come as you are. Instructions for people joining this meal the first time can be found on p. 9.

Parking for people with disabilities are available next to the Meditation Labyrinth. You are welcome to bring your walker or wheelchair into the sanctuary. If you have hearing difficulties, please ask one of the greeters for a sound enhancing headset. The Service will begin in the Parish Hall with the Service of Light.

Order of Service

Welcome & Introduction to Service

Service of Light

Celebrant: Jesus is the light of the world.

All: A light no darkness can extinguish.

Celebrant: Dear friends in Christ, on this holy day, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together to celebrate the Passover of the Lord. We are confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

The celebrant then prepares the Paschal Candle saying,

Celebrant: Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega. All time belongs to him and all the ages. To him be glory and power through every age for ever.

All: Amen.

Then the celebrant inserts five grains of incense into the candle, saying, Celebrant: By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us.

All: Amen.

The celebrant lights the candle using the flame from the Easter fire at the Sunrise Service saying:

Celebrant: May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

We chant the following acclamation three times as we process to the sanctuary:

- Deacon: The light of Christ.
 - All: Thanks be to God.


After each acclamation, we sing (CP405):



Alleluia, alleluia! Give thanks to the risen Lord. Alleluia, alleluia! Give praise to God's name.

The altar candles are then lit from the light from the Paschal Candle.

- Opening Hymn...... Jesus Christ Is Risen Today (CP 203 for harmonies)
 - 1. Jesus Christ is risen to day, alleluia! our triumphant holy day, alleluia! who did once, upon the cross, alleluia! suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!
 - 2. Hymns of praise then let us sing, alleluia! unto Christ our heavenly King, alleluia! who endured the cross and grave, alleluia!
 - 3. But the pains which he endured, alleluia! our salvation have procured; alleluia! now above the sky he's king. alleluia! where the angels ever sing. Alleluia!



People May he fill our hearts with joy.

- **Song of Praise**...... Glory to God on High (see CP365 for harmonies)
 - Glory to God on high, and peace to all on earth. We worship you, we give you thanks, our heavenly King. We give you praise, almighty God and Father blessed in glory bright.
 - 2. Our Saviour, Jesus Christ, the Father's only Son, the sacrificial Lamb, who saves the world from sin, have mercy Lord. Beside the Father's hand enthroned, now hear our prayer.
 - 3. You only are the Lord. You only are most high. You only are the holy one, Lord Jesus Christ. And now you reign with Father and with Spirit one in glorious light.

The Collect of the Day

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Living Lord, whose love displaced the gravity of stone; you entrusted women, who loved beyond death, with news of resurrection:

All: we praise you for the open gospel which ends where Easter faith begins; accept our fear, our disbelief and take us into this new world led by the risen Son; through Jesus Christ, the firstborn of the dead. Amen

All are seated

Children's Time

Children are invited to come forward. After the reflection, all rise as able. People sitting on the aisle are invited to form an arch for children to come through as they head out for Sunday School as we sing **Sing a Happy Alleluia**



After each reading, there will be a short time of quiet meditation

Praise the Holy One, who is so good, whose faithful love endures forever! Let the house of Israel proclaim, "God's faithful love endures forever!" //*R*






Prayer over the Gifts

Eucharistic Preface

"Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". This is a ritual meal to re-enact the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his friends to remind them of his sacrificial love for humanity and the whole creation. All stand as able.



to give you thanks and praise, Holy God, mighty and immortal, through your Son, Jesus Christ. Above all we delight to praise you for the resurrection of our Lord, the true Passover Lamb who takes away the sin of the world, who by his death destroyed our death and by his rising restores our life.

And so with Mary Magdalene and Peter, and all the witnesses of the resurrection, with earth and seas and all their creatures, with angels and archangels,

we praise your name and join their unending hymn:



We give you thanks for your Son: at the heart of human life, near to those who suffer, beside the sinner, among the poor, with us now.



On the night he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat;

this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."


Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:



We pray for the gift of your Spirit: in our gathering, upon this bread, within this cup, among your people, throughout the world.

The Lord's Prayer



The Invitation Receiving Communion

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread.

If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.

Blessing


Celebrant: God of resurrection, you have rolled the stone away and the tomb of our world has been opened wide.

Terry Aleck, our Native Drumming Circle leader, is a major player featured in this video. Terry will be present for a dialogue circle after the film. The day concludes with a native drumming circle at 4 pm. All are welcome.

Diocesan School for Parish Development: An opportunity for both clergy and laity to develop skills in congregation organizational development held at Rosemary Heights Retreat Centre in Surrey. There is a Parish Bursary available to help defray the costs.

Touring Sacred Spaces of Vancouver: Two day-long guided tours of some of the most significant sacred spaces in the Lower Mainland have been organized to take place in May and June, 2015. This is an initiative of the Ecumenical Multi-faith Unit (EMU) of the Anglican Diocese of New Westminster, and the Inter-Spiritual Centre of Vancouver.

The tours of several different faith and indigenous spaces throughout the Lower Mainland include a Buddhist temple, a Roman Catholic cathedral, a synagogue, a mosque, a Sikh temple, a First Nations ceremonial space, an Ismaili Jamatkhana and a Ukrainian Orthodox cathedral.

Participants will travel together from each venue in a chartered bus, with lunch being hosted by members of one of the faith communities. An active exchange of information and discussions will be encouraged amongst all who are interested in interfaith experiences. By listening to one another and learning from one another, we hope to come to some appreciation of each other by also experiencing each other's sacred spaces.

At St. Hilda's our aim is to create a sacred space where we can be nourished and nourish others through our practices of Worship, Hospitality, and Justice.


