

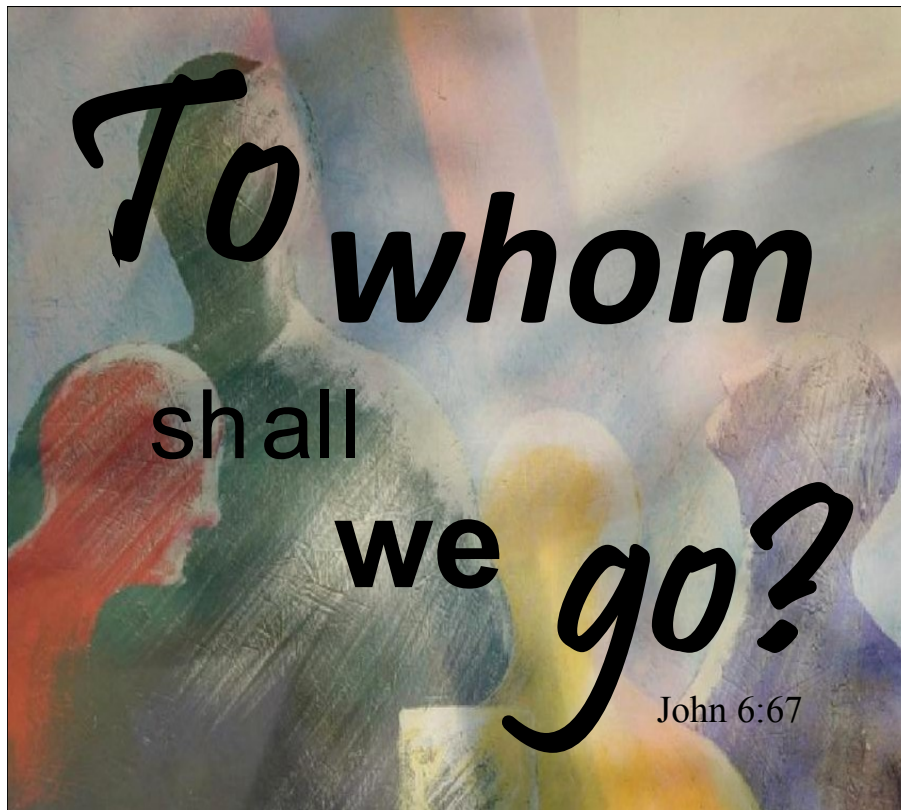


Hymn Sing






