



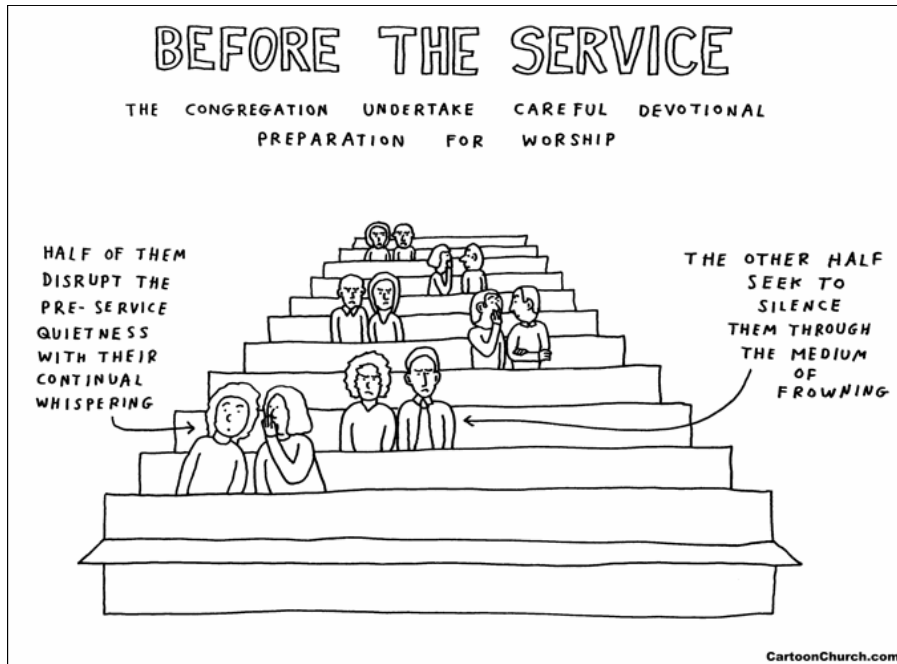

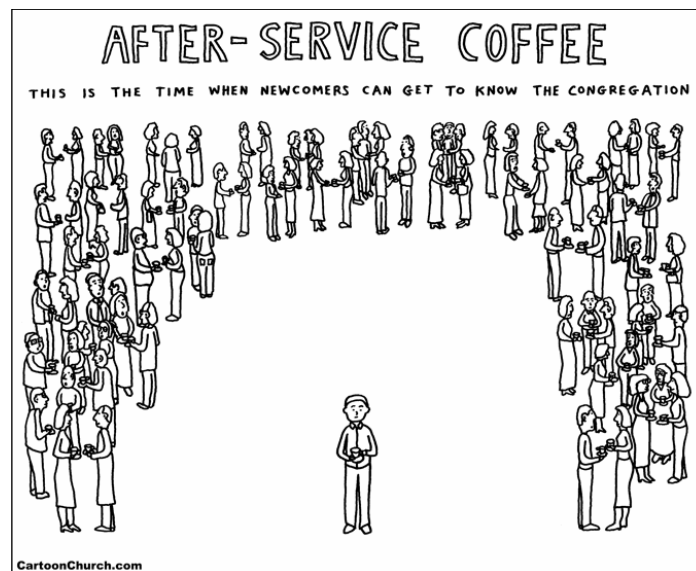
## Parish Events and Notices






