Worship This Morning

This morning, we shall gather to celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple, traditionally also known as *Candlemas*.

The feast day commemorates the event in the Gospel of Luke when the 40-day old Jesus was presented at the Temple and being recognized by Simeon and Anna, figures representing the Jewish patriarch and matriarch as the light to all nations. This is a beautiful feast filled with images of light in the midst of darkness. It is customary to have church candles blessed on this day, accompanied by a procession carrying lights. This year because of an unusual early Easter, Candlemas lies exactly half way between the birth of Christ Jesus and his passion shown to us on the cross of Golgotha. Liturgically and spiritually, this day invites us to connect our joy of welcoming the light (Christmas) and the necessary pain of the path of descent to the cross that brings us new life and wholeness (Good Friday and Easter).

We begin our worship this morning by gathering in the Parish Hall for the blessing of candles. If you use candles at home for your devotions, please bring them along for a blessing. Tapers will be given out, lit, and then we shall all carry the light of Christ processing into the Sanctuary.

Being the last Sunday before Lent, you were asked to **return any palm crosses** you received from last year. During coffee hour, there will be a simple ceremony to burn these emblems of glory into ashes which will be imposed on our forehead on Ash Wednesday February 10.

The Invitation Receiving Communion

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If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread.

If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.
