Season of Creation

We are finishing a new season of the church in which we celebrated the beauty and the life of Creation. Rocks and hills and trees and flowers, Storms and Oceans, Water and Cosmos; Animals of all types, birds that fly. Together, we have pondered how we see the divine in Creation and our responsibility for it all in the light of divine love and compassion.

Universe refers to all that exists, every dimension of time and space, spiritual and material. The universe is both the glittering galaxies that humans have begun to explore as well as distant domains far beyond our imagination. In addition, there are unknown domains deep within each tiny molecule that we have yet to comprehend. All creation is one sacred cosmic reality, a spiritual universe filled with God's presence. The special focus for this service is not only the universe in all its immensity and wonder, but also the spiritual impulse or presence that permeates the universe and is connected with each of us on Earth. That impulse is also called Wisdom!

We give thanks for this community, also a creation of beauty and variety formed over many years in which we know and walk the Way of Jesus together. For music and relationships, for reflection and affirmation, for bread and wine shared together, we give thanks this day and ask that we may allow all we have been given to enhance and enrich our lives and through us, the lives of others.

WHO WE ARE

St. Hilda, situated on the unceded traditional territory of the shíshálh First Nation, is a member of the Anglican Church of Canada & the worldwide Anglican Communion. As a community, we welcome & celebrate human diversity - including spirituality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, & abilities. We aim to create a space where people of any faith or none can question & discover the sacred in life through openness, struggle, laughter & prayer, lived out through a common commitment to be in solidarity with the poor & marginalized, & to cherish creation.

CHILDREN

Children play a central part when we gather to worship. We welcome them as they gather for a Children's Time at the beginning of the service and then send them off to Sunday School. They return in time for Communion—the Lord's supper (grape juice is available for communing). A Quiet Room is available for parents with babies and toddlers at the back of the Church.



Eucharistic Prayer





Receiving Communion

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread.
