If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread.

If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.







Homeless Shelter Update: Church Committee was in consensus to approve RainCity's request for an extension for the use of the Church's Annex until January 15, 2018. The terms of the extension remain the same (cost recovery, a loss of use charge of \$1500 per month, and one month notice for extension). The extension is necessary given the timelines RainCity received from the District of Sechelt regarding their rezoning application. The next date also provides a reasonable timeframe for some upgrading of the new temporary shelter at the Upper Deck Guesthouse. Please continue to hold the shelter staff and guests in your prayers as they anticipate this transition.

Breaking News!

Minister of Justice Jody Wilson-Raybould announced this week that the **Government of Canada is supporting Bill C-262**, An Act to Ensure that the Laws of Canada are in Harmony with the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples . This is incredibly encouraging... BUT don't stop raising your voices and writing to MPs. Until the actual vote happens, and the Government stands in the House in support of 262, we've got to keep up the loving pressure!! Debate at second reading is now scheduled for December 5, 2017 in the House of Commons.

We need to reinforce with each MP how important their support is (knowing that many of them probably don't know a ton about UNDRIP or C-262). More info is on the leaflets "Walk the Talk" and cards to mail to our MP are in the breezeway
