WHO WE ARE

St. Hilda's, situated on the unceded traditional territory of the shishálh First Nation, is a member of the Anglican Church of Canada and the worldwide Anglican Communion. As a community, we welcome and celebrate human diversity - including spirituality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, and abilities. We aim to create a space where people of any faith or none can question and discover the sacred in life through openness, struggle, laughter and prayer, lived out through a common commitment to be in solidarity with the poor and marginalized, and to cherish Creation.

CHILDREN

Children play a central part when we gather to worship. We welcome them as they gather for a Children's Time at the beginning of the service. We send them off with a song for Sunday School, and they return in time for Communion—the Lord's supper. A Nursery Room is available for parents with babies and toddlers at the back of the Church.

A Bidding for Christmas

My sisters and brothers in Christ, in this season when we celebrate the birth of Jesus, let it be our duty and delight to hear once more the message of the angels and go in heart and mind to Bethlehem to see the Son of God lying in a manger.

As we hear the reading of God's holy word, let us reflect on the original vision of unity and love announced by the creator of the universe *Genesis 2*, find new hope in the promise that God is with us *Isaiah 61*, join with Mary, the favoured handmaid, and offer ourselves in service to God's holy and saving purpose for the world *Luke 1*, magnify the God of mercy who breaks the power of tyrants and exalts the humble Luke 1, raise our voices with the messenger who announces good news of great joy to all people *Luke 2*.

The bidding continues.

As we mark once more the mystery of the Word made flesh, let us join with the song of angels and saints and make this place ring with our carols and hymns of praise.

But first, let us remember the poverty of the birth of the Prince of Peace, and pray for the poor, the cold, the hungry, and those among us who find that there is no room for them at the inn.

Let us remember the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt, and pray for the oppressed, refugees, the isolated, and those on the edges of our society.

Let us remember that the Lord of Glory experienced the pain of life and death, and pray for the sick, the anxious, the weary, and the bereaved.

And remembering the promise that he shall reign for ever and ever, let us pray for the rulers of the nations, for peace and justice on earth, for the unity and mission of the Church, that we may be a sign that God's rule on earth has already begun.

With joy in our hearts, let us hear again the story of the birth of Christ, and join with Mary and Joseph, with shepherds and wise men, and with all our forebears in faith in offering our worship.


Collect



Art Exhibit of Victorian stained glass

Two lancet windows from the firm Clayton & Bell, made in 1885, will be on loan from Dick Clayton for the seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.

Clayton and Bell was one of the most prolific and proficient English workshops of stained glass during the latter half of the 19th century & early 20th century. The partners were John Richard Clayton (great-grandfather of Dick Clayton) and Alfred Bell. The company was founded in 1855 and continued until 1993. Their windows are found throughout the United Kingdom, in the United States, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. Clayton and Bell's commercial success was due to the high demand for stained-glass windows at the time, their use of the best quality glass available, the excellence of their designs and their employment of efficient factory methods of production. <u>Update on Ndandini Scholarship donation</u>: Our partner, the Sunshine Coast Rotary Club was informed recently by the Belleville Rotary Club that the Belleville Club is no longer able to be the Canadian charity to forward the fund to the Rotary Club in Kenya. This would mean that until a new charity with the ability to forward funds overseas is found, all new donations collected for Ndandini scholarship are not eligible for a charitable donation receipt for income tax purpose based on CRA regulations. If you have given to Ndandini Scholarship recently, your donations may not be eligible for a 2018 tax-deductible receipt as a result. If this is a problem for you and you would like to redirect the funds to another cause or have your donations refunded, please contact Maggie Scott, Envelope Secretary. The Sunshine Coast Rotary Club is applying for its own charity status currently to prevent the same situation from happening in the future.
