





Eucharistic Prayer of the West Coast

Eucharist means "thanksgiving." This is a ritual meal to re-enact the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his friends to remind them of his sacrificial love for humanity and the whole creation. All stand as able.



The Invitation

Receiving Communion

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.

ALL in this sacrament we receive the promise of salvation.

May we, like Mary, be obedient to your will.

We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ the Lord. Amen.

Art Exhibit of Victorian stained glass

Two lancet windows from the firm Clayton & Bell, made in 1885, will be on loan from Dick Clayton for the seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.

Clayton and Bell was one of the most prolific and proficient English workshops of stained glass during the latter half of the 19th century & early 20th century. The partners were John Richard Clayton (great-grandfather of Dick Clayton) and Alfred Bell. The company was founded in 1855 and continued until 1993. Their windows are found throughout the United Kingdom, in the United States, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. Clayton and Bell's commercial success was due to the high demand for stained-glass windows at the time, their use of the best quality glass available, the excellence of their designs and their employment of efficient factory methods of production. Emilie will be speaking about her recent trip to Colombia, up the Naya River, and linking this with her experiences with the pipeline resistance. Patti is an outstanding, gifted teacher of singing (check out pattipwellchoirs.com). She will teach us songs that are about connecting with one another and with the source of all life.

<u>Update on Ndandini Scholarship donation</u>: Our partner, the Sunshine Coast Rotary Club was informed recently by the Belleville Rotary Club that the Belleville Club is no longer able to be the Canadian charity to forward the fund to the Rotary Club in Kenya. This would mean that until a new charity with the ability to forward funds overseas is found, all new donations collected for Ndandini scholarship are not eligible for a charitable donation receipt for income tax purpose based on CRA regulations. If you have given to Ndandini Scholarship re-

cently, your donations may not be eligible for a 2018 tax-deductible receipt as a result. If this is a problem for you and you would like to redirect the funds to another cause or have your donations refunded, please contact Maggie Scott, Envelope Secretary. The Sunshine Coast Rotary Club is applying for its own charity status currently to prevent the same situation from happening in the future.
