Rector's Musings

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

I came across Rick Steves, the travel guru's *European Easter* program on PBS earlier this week. He surprised me by being such a great evangelist of the Good News giving historical-critical information on Easter, explaining the rituals and symbolism in simple and captivating ways far better than many priests, and being a great storyteller. Steves helped me see Easter as a season that encapsulates new life coming forth in so many different forms: light and warmth after a long dark and cold winter, the end of rationing of food, new growth and colours... etc., all because of the Word (or God's blueprint) taken on flesh in every aspect of Creation. Alleluia!

The Church recognizes Easter as being a season of 50 days to emphasize that we should look at Jesus' resurrection to new life *not* as a point-in-time event but *an enfolding season*. When we read Jesus' apparition narrative over the next seven Sundays, we would notice that the stories of Easter parallel closer to a bereavement process than a single joyous celebration. To me, that is exactly how I feel I am called to live this Eastertide: to feel the loss of what needs to be let go so that I may begin to recognize and live into the new life bestowed before me.

What is God inviting you to let go this season? Would you seize the Easter faith to see new life beyond what is lost?

On a personal note, I will be having my last Sunday at St. Hilda's on Trinity Sunday, June 16. This would allow me to take my remaining 2 weeks of holiday before starting my new role at SCACL. June 16 seems so far away still, yet it is also so close. Let's continue musing together for the time God has given us.

Welcome & Introduction to Service

Service of Light

Celebrant Jesus is the light of the world.

PEOPLE A light no darkness can extinguish.

Celebrant Dear friends in Christ, on this holy day, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites all God's beloveds throughout the world to come together to celebrate the Passover of the Lord. We are confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

The celebrant then prepares the Paschal Candle saying,

Celebrant Christ yesterday and today,
the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega.
All time belongs to him and all the ages.
To him be glory and power through every age for ever.

ALL Amen.

Then the celebrant inserts five grains of incense into the candle, saying,

Celebrant By his holy and glorious wounds
may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us.

ALL Amen.

The celebrant lights the candle saying:

Celebrant May the light of Christ, rising in glory,
dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

We chant the following acclamation three times as we process to the sanctuary:

Deacon The light of Christ.

PEOPLE Thanks be to God.

After each acclamation, we sing chant three times:

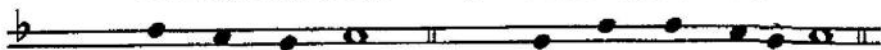

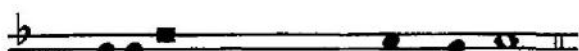

The Invitation

Receiving Communion

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation, then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant.

The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. Wine and unfermented grape juice are served. If you would prefer to receive a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, please inform the person administering the bread or wine when they approach you. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead of Communion, you are welcome to come forward and place your hands across your chest.
